

What is DRCOG?






DRCOG is:

- Council of Governments (COG)
 - Voluntary association of local governments
- Regional Planning Commission (RPC)
 - Formed under state law
- Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO)
 - Federal designation
- Area Agency on Aging (AAA)
 - Federal designation
- Has responsibility under Clean Water Act
 - Prescribed by state and federal law







DRCOG Board and Standing Committees



How the Board Works

- Board of Directors meets monthly
 - So do TAC, RTC, and MVIC
- Board:
 - each member has one representative
 - Denver has two
 - each representative has one vote
 - bylaws allow weighted voting, very rarely used
- Meetings
 - average attendance: 70% of members
 - only modest reliance on a "consent" agenda
 - 4 to 6 public hearings/year



Key Transportation - Land Use Coordination Initiatives

- Metro Vision Plan (umbrella)
 - 10% increase in region's overall density (2000-2035)
 - Urban Growth Boundary/Area
 - Urban Centers
- Metro Vision Regional Transportation Plan
 - "...integrate with and support the social, economic, and physical land use development of the region..."
- Mile High Compact



Key Coordination Initiatives (cont'd)

- TIP: Metro Vision implementation points
- Fixed guideway transit implementation
 - FasTracks (4/10% sales tax 2004)
 - TOD efforts (DRCOG + RTD)
 - STAMPs (2007-2011, \$2.5 M)
- New this summer
 - Sustainability goals
 - TIP funds for Urban Centers planning (in addition to STAMPs)
 - Revisions to Metro Vision implementation points in TIP: higher priority to urban centers
 - Increased emphasis on community design in Metro Vision
